ABOUT HELVIDIUS

HELVIDIUS is a non-partisan, scholarly journal devoted to the discussion of economic, legal, and political theories and their various policy implications.

The Helvidius Group was established by Peter Tomassi C'91 and Neil Coffee C'91 in 1981. It is named after Helvidius Priscus, a Roman statesman and philosopher of the first century AD. Helvidius Priscus was known for his virtue, independence of mind and staunch advocacy of republican government. His beliefs brought him into direct conflict with the Emperors Nero and Vespasian, both of whom banished him. Helvidius' defense of liberty and freedom of speech, as well as his opposition to dynastic succession, eventually led to his execution.

He is known as the first martyr for free speech.

SUBMISSIONS

Articles may be submitted to the Editorial Board for consideration throughout the year. Suitable papers can include those completed for lecture courses and seminars, a junior/senior thesis, or independent research. We accept articles from undergraduate and graduate students, as well as interested faculty members.

Format. Submissions should be double-spaced, on 8 1/2 x 11" paper with wide margins. Upon acceptance of an article, authors will be asked to submit a copy on computer disk. Place concise section headings at appropriate junctures within the paper. In addition, provide a short biography indicating the author's full name, mailing address, program of study, and university affiliation. Length. 1500 words is the minimum. Longer works that explore issues in greater depth are preferred.

Citation. Use in-text, parenthetical citations. Explanatory notes should take the form of end notes. Please prepare a bibliography in accordance to guidelines set forth by the MLA.
